

ON CAMPUS VOLUNTEER SAFETY INFORMATION:

Medical

There is plenty of medical personal on campus to help with any medical issue. Medical personal will be in RED Shirts or Orthopedic Associate Shirts.

If an athlete needs medical attention while on SMCC Campus, please take the following steps:

- Assess the scene. If the scene is not safe (i.e. if the cyclist is in the middle of the road and can't be moved) create barricade around the athlete to protect them. Stay with athlete and let people around you know that we need medical attention. Use your cell phone to call your volunteer coordinator – if emergency, you can dial 911.
- Try to keep the athlete from moving. Safety of the injured person is of utmost importance. Create a human barricade around them and keep them warm. Call others to help you.
- If the athlete is able to speak and doesn't appear to have threatening injuries, call your volunteer coordinator to let them know of the situation.
- If you aren't sure how severe the situation is, call your volunteer coordinator to discuss.
- **If media is present after an accident and asks you questions, please refer them to the Race Director or Maine Cancer Foundation. Do not give out any information about the accident. This is the job of Race Staff.**

Medical
